1st DAY: ARRIVAL TO ZAGREB

Arrival to Zagreb airport, meeting with LDC coach and transfer to hotel.
Meeting with local guide for guided city tour.

Zagreb is capital city of the Republic of Croatia, it's a comfortable and charming combination of Central Europe and the Adriatic. It is a city where you will find Baroque and Art Nouveau architecture blended with a pronounced air of south style. Zagreb is Croatia's capital, as well as being a business centre, university centre, city of culture, art and entertainment. Springing up from two medieval settlements - Kaptol and Gradec, which form the core of the old Upper Town, it is a true Central European city. Have a ride on the Zagreb's blue tram climb up the funicular to the Upper Town and visit the Lotrščak tower and take the best panoramic view and photos of Zagreb city, St. Mark's Church, Kamenita vrata, museums and galleries.



Transfer to hotel in the evening and overnight.

2nd DAY: ZAGREB – PLITVICE – SPLIT

Check out in the morning and transfer to Plitvice.
Arrival to Plitvice and meeting with local guide.
Start of guided tour.

NP Plitvice lakes is the largest *national park* in Croatia. The national park is world-famous for its lakes arranged in cascades. The tour is consisted of walking through the park of 16 bigger and smaller lakes connected with 92 cascades and waterfalls, unique phenomenon more than 4000 years old, that was put on the list of UNESCO's list of World Natural Heritage. Sightseeing includes main panoramic view photo stops, from which you can take breath taking photos of big and smaller waterfalls



Transfer to Split in the afternoon.
Arrival to hotel.

Check in and overnight.

3rd DAY: SPLIT

Meeting with local guide in the morning.
Start of guided city tour.

Split is a city in Central Dalmatia, Croatia. The city was originally built around the Diocletian palace (a palace/fort built for the retired Roman emperor Diocletian) where the locals sought refuge centuries ago. Despite initial appearances, however, the city is not a small tourist town, and extends over a large area well beyond the ancient core. Wandering the historic center of Split you can still clearly see the Roman walls, squares, and temples. Visit Diocletian's Palace and Mausoleum, the Grgur Ninski Statue and the Cathedral and Bell Tower of St. Domnius and other sites. Also, the city's coves offer several lovely beaches, including central Bacvice.



In the afternoon, enjoy free time in Dalmatian metropole and discover Split from park Marijanl to take panoramic photos and enjoy some time in nature.

Dubrovnik is a stunningly intact walled city on the Adriatic Sea coast of the extreme south of Croatia. Although its population barely exceeds 40,000, it's one of the most prominent tourist resorts of the Mediterranean and listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1979. Walk through city's marble streets and along the ancient city walls that will inspire you. Visit the famous 14th century

Franciscan monastery situated at the Placa, the main street of Dubrovnik. Then take cable car to Srđ hill from which you will have chance to take stunning photos of Dubrovnik old city and it's archipelago.
